

**Lusaka Workshop on NHDRs**

This proposal is built around a three days workshop, including a whole day dedicated to group discussions.

**1-First day: HD approach and the data issue**

***Part 1: The approach***

**3-Third day: Capacity building : global, regional and country levels. Conclusion.**

Specific inputs are requested from two or three COs where good practices have been implemented. The six principles referred to are as follows:

- National ownership:
- Participatory and inclusive preparation.
- Independence of analysis.
- Quality of analysis.
- Flexibility and creativity in presentation.
- Sustained follow up.

COs with good practices should volunteer and inform the organizers of, their intention to make a presentation and the principle they intend to illustrate.
